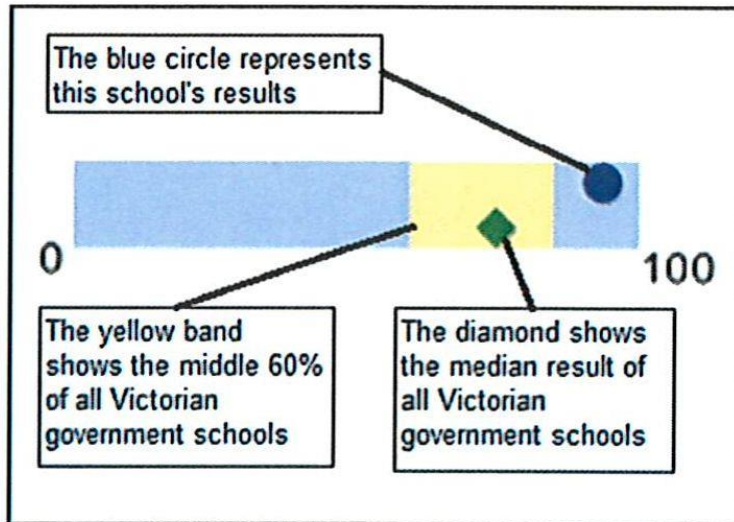

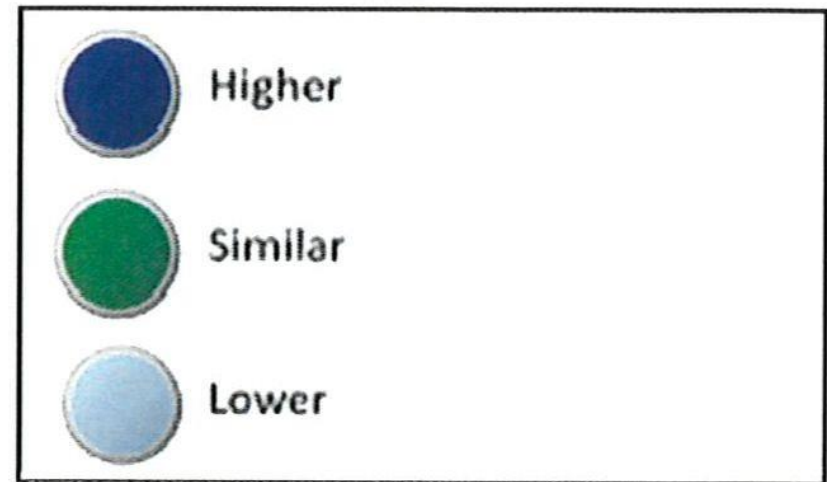

Based on the school's Student Family Occupation and Education index which takes into account parents' occupations and education.

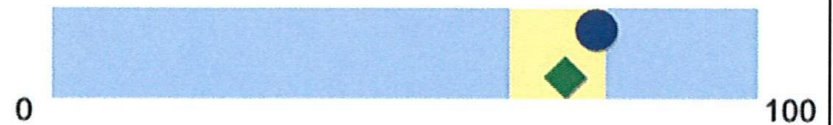


# School Profile

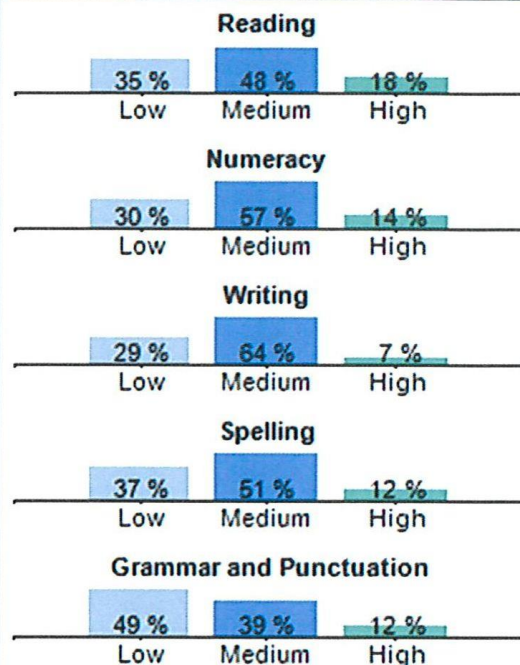


# Achievement

## NAPLAN Learning Gain Year 5 - Year 7

Learning gain of students from Year 5 to Year 7 in the following domains: Reading, Numeracy, Writing, Spelling & Grammar and Punctuation.

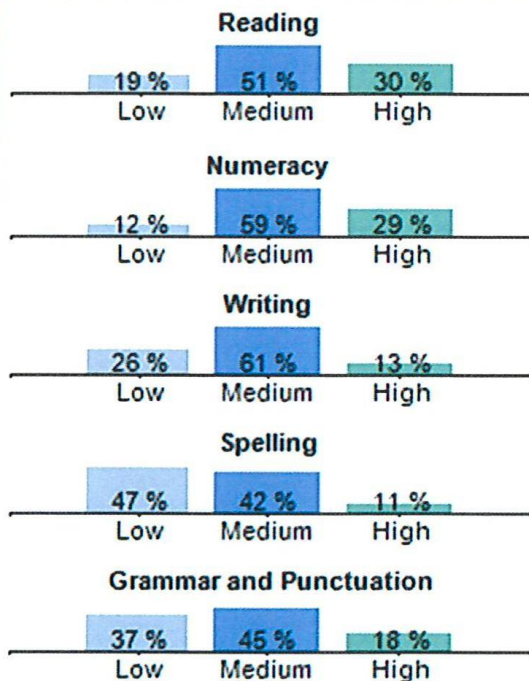

## Victorian Certificate of Education (VCE)

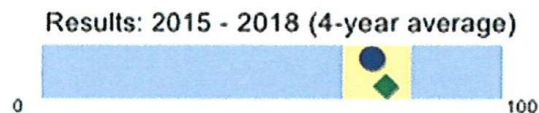

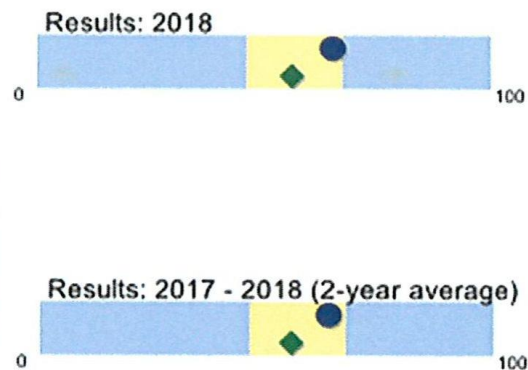
